#### Reminder: Screening/Testing Site Serves 2 Purposes

- 1. Call if you think you have symptoms
- 2. Prescreen
- 3. If you have symptoms you will be asked to self-quarantine. If you are tested too early you risk a false negative reading
- 4. Do Not go into public, symptoms can worsen
- 5. Open from 8am 5pm 7 days a week
- 6. Do Not go to the Emergency Room
- 7. No one will be turned away from the screening/testing site
- 8. Facility is available for 30 days maybe longer depending on threat of virus
- 9. Working hand in hand with the City of Kingsville
- 10. Looking into shelter for those who might test positive for the virus
