- A. Public Hearing—Judge Madrid opened hearing.
- B. Public Comments—There are no public comments. Judge states he sat down with George from Fulcrum and did a County Assessment. It's pretty easy as I know the things we need already and we have a wish list. We really looked at potential projects on how the money, if won, could be spent in the best interest of the community. We divided it into different areas. There's one I think David Garcia doesn't know about and neither does Commissioner Salinas was one thing we threw in there. You know how we have problems with the Human Services building, ever since I took office we have had problems with it, roof problems, electrical problems, things of that nature. That would be allowing improvements for that facility because they do support things like chill zones and warming centers for the community. we would need generators and things of that nature. But they also are promoting healthy life styles so what we talked about creating the Botanical Garden Walking Trail we have been talking about for some time would become a reality. Just to give you a visual it will be fenced in, doing the daytime the Seniors can use it and in the evening the public can use it. It will have the walking trail in the middle. Think of it as a circle. It is going to be a nice walking trail. Think of it as a big circle with a pond in the middle with ducks and a fountain in the middle. We are going to plot it out to 20 X 40 plats and let's say we make 50 plats, we are going to allow the community to adopt some of them, free of charge. We are going to run underground water and 110 electricity to them. Let's say the City of Kingsville wanted to adopt one of the plats. When you walk into the Botanical Garden, now your entering a place similar to Epcot Center, but it's Kingland. They can decorate it any way they want. They can add a Gazebo, benches, foral arrangements, grass. Groups such as the 4-H Chapter, the high school, the university can apply for a plat. That's just a thought, we build

Our best person Petra Reyna had to walk out, but we had a chance to meet with Rudy and discuss potential projects the county could undertake that are eligible under this funding opportunity. The Judge indicates it's an opportunity for the county to capture about \$20 million in grant monies without having a match component, and the idea is to provide a resilient structure to the community due to climate change. We all know that we are having colder winters, warmer summers, more intense storms and as part of that it's merging the technology of everyone else, wind energy, solar panels to try and make the infrastructure a lot stronger. One of the keys is part of this money has to be allocated for a resilient center and that was what the Judge was talking about. This facility, I know, requires upgrades but I know it requires prime candidate for dedicating \$2-\$3M towards it. What will that money do, it allows you as a county to go in and rehabilitate it and make it following a green concept and re-roof it with a cool roof. Once that is done you an come in and put in solar panels to be able to provide power to the facility and of course save the county money on electrical, also upgrade to the most efficient HVAC units to conserve energy, put in the necessary rain loggers so we capture rain and we can harvester system to water some of the cells the Judge is indicating. Along with that equipment permeable basis technology that would capture water to a pond concept and of course it's all about enhancing the living environment and also putting in a walking trail so people can enjoy it, also planting trees that are natural to the area. It must meet all the criteria. Drainage is also another thing that can be worked on. There's always a need for additional water supply in the area. We talked about working with a non-profit water supply company in the city and provide additional ground water wells and along with that to make that green. Implementing of solar panels for wind turbines to enhance the power, the same thing there are areas in the city that are now creating the waste water with on site septic systems. This program is all about doing away with these pollution problems and coming in and putting in a conventional waste water collection system and again that comes with decommissioning ground septic tanks, piping all of that to a lift system and again this program those pumps need to operate using turbine power or solar power to enhance that. Also there is the opportunity to come in and with these monies and help those economic disadvantaged folks that live in mobile homes the program allows the candidate to come in, take that mobile home and give them a brand new one with the most efficient appliances and equipment with solar panes that will help them pay for that. The weatherization program is also very good and this money can be used for helping these folks. It can also be used for drainage issues. It is a very good program.

So the Judge has given us directions as to what is coming with a proposed lay out. You can expect us coming back to you and present to you and the Commissioners as we come forward.

We have a November 21, 2024 deadline to get application in. Our intend is to get it in by the end of October 2024. Why, because these are rolling type applications. These are applications that are reviewed as soon as they are received. They have allocated \$2B in November 2022, as of July only \$325,000.00 has been used. There are \$150M allocated for "border cities"

and we fall under this category. We are real excite to have been selected to put this application together. We look forward to doing a good job for the county. I think our odds are pretty good and look forward to seeing you in the future. Part of this program is that the applicant hold a public meeting to give the citizens an opportunity to hear what the intend of the funding is and also if they have any input. We would love to forward that to the Judge's office so we can have that for our records. Judge if you have any questions, that is my presentation.

Judge states this is a hug opportunity for Kleberg County. We are going to put our heads together and really knock one out of the park. We are requesting \$20M, that will put a lot of people to work and create a great opportunity. We are going to knock it out by the end of October, so if there is any question and suggestions please let us know. If there is any request for more information, we can get back to them.

Commissioner Schultz asked if that will help the lift station in Ricardo to which Judge Madrid replied that it will help the lift stations both in Ricardo and Riviera, Baffin Bay and the coastal homes.
